

## SEPARATING STORM DEBRIS

Separate storm debris into the FIVE CATEGORIES shown here.



NORMAL Household trash

Normal household waste, recyclables and bagged debris of any kind will NOT be collected with storm debris. You should continue to follow your normal garbage removal schedule.

### PLACEMENT FOR PICKUP

Place separated debris at the edge of your property near the road. Do NOT block the roadway or storm water drains.



## APPLIANCES & WHITE GOODS

**AIR CONDITIONERS DISHWASHERS FREEZERS REFRIGERATORS** (PUT FOOD WASTE WITH **HOUSEHOLD TRASH)** 

**STOVES WASHERS & DRYERS WATER HEATERS** 



Do NOT place debris under power lines and trees, or near poles, mailboxes, fire hydrants, utility boxes, or other structures that can delay removal.

Do **NOT** place debris on driveways or sidewalks. Do **NOT** mix household hazardous waste or electronics with other debris. Bring them to the St. Lucie County Baling & Recycling Facility for proper disposal.
