

Improving for the Better!!

On April 23, 2024, the St. Lucie County Board of County Commissioners approved entering into a sales and purchase agreement to acquire a local motel for \$1.15 million, with plans to convert it into a shelter for homeless veterans. This initiative is a key part of the county's ongoing efforts to provide critical housing and services for residents in need. The shelter will not only offer tempo-

rary housing but also provide vital support services such as mental health counseling, job training, and housing assistance to help veterans transi-



tion into permanent, stable housing.

During the month of September, the County issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to identify an entity capable of managing the day-to-day operations of the shelter and is in the process of evaluating proposals. This partnership will ensure that veterans receive high-quality care and resources tailored to their specific needs. The project represents a significant step forward in the county's commitment to addressing homelessness and housing affordability.

DID YOU KNOW?!



Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law, also known as the Sunshine Law, was passed in 1967 to ensure that the public has access to government meetings and records. The law applies to all state, county, and municipal boards and commissions, and requires that:

- Meetings are open to the public
- Reasonable notice of meetings is given
- Minutes of meetings are taken and recorded promptly
- Actions taken at closed meetings are not binding



The law also guarantees the public's right to inspect and copy public records in a timely manner upon request, which includes any documents used by the government in the course of its business. This could include: letters, memos, texts, photographs, videos, letters, maps, computer records, books, data processing software, and sound recordings. However, some records may be exempt or confidential, and the release of these records may be discretionary.

<u>F.S. 286.011</u> states: All meetings of any board or commission of any state agency or authority or of any agency or authority of any county, municipal corporation, or political subdivision, except as otherwise provided in the Constitution, including meetings with or attended by any person elected to such board or commission, but who has not yet taken office, at which official acts are to be taken are declared to be public meetings open to the public.

<u>Meet the Team</u> — Meet Jennifer Hance. In 1995 Jeniffer moved from Connecticut to Port St. Lucie and has lived in St. Lucie County ever since. In July 2007, Jennifer started working for the County's Housing division through a temp agency and by December of the same year, was hired as a full-time, permanent county employee. She rose through the ranks and currently serves as the Director of Community Services.

Her duties and responsibilities involve overseeing a variety of programs that address community needs. This includes managing affordable housing initiatives, leading human services efforts, and providing support to vulnerable populations like low-income families, veterans, and the homeless. Additionally, she oversees the proper appropriation of grants, partners with local organizations such as the Treasure Coast Homeless Service Council and Habitat for Humanity, and has oversight of the County's Veteran Services. As an advocate for quality-of-life ventures, she is spearheading several projects but one that she is particularly passionate about is the transformation of a motel into a veteran's homeless shelter which is scheduled to be complete in 2025.

protection and reduction of pets in the county by assisting law enforcement in animal cruelty cases, offering a Spay/Neuter Assistance Program for owned pets and Trap, Neuter, Vaccinate, Return (TNVR) Program for community cats, and providing education through information and en-

forcement of state and local statutes regarding the possession, ownership, care and custody of our pet population in order to ensure public safety.
